<b>Type</b>	Scholarship – monetary support for learning to a maximum of \$20,000 per scholarship.
<b>Duration</b>	12 months – commencing the awarded date

<b>Scholarship Description</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Scholarship offers a local student a pathway towards a career in aviation by first obtaining their Private Pilot Licence (PPL)</li> <li>• In obtaining a PPL, the student will:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• learn to control the aircraft on the ground,</li> <li>• take off and control the aeroplane in normal and abnormal flight; and</li> <li>• land the aeroplane.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Additionally, the student will learn to execute advanced manoeuvres and procedures and learn the following elements:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Manage situational awareness in aircraft flight</li> <li>• Manage aircraft fuel calculations</li> <li>• Apply the principles of air-law to aviation</li> <li>• Operate at a controlled aerodrome</li> <li>• Operate at non-towered aerodromes</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Operate in class G airspace</li> <li>• Operate and manage aircraft systems</li> <li>• Plan a navigation flight under visual flight rules</li> <li>• Manage human factors in aviation operations</li> <li>• Manage aircraft passengers and cargo</li> <li>• Implement threat and error management strategies</li> <li>• Maintain aircraft radio communication</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Additional educational aspects: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The student will gain knowledge of Basic Air Law pertaining to Flight Operations which will assist towards a career in Charter/Airline Operations or Aerodrome Operations</li> <li>• The student will learn about the different airspace procedures that will be beneficial if they are considering a career in Air Traffic Control</li> <li>• The student will also learn about aircraft mechanics which may foster an interest in Aircraft Maintenance Engineering</li> <li>• Many of the elements can be used towards Recognition of Prior Learning towards a Diploma in Aviation (Commercial Pilot Licence) or a Bachelor of Aviation (Flight Operations) Degree.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• The Scholarship provides the following benefits: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 12 month program, commencing the awarded date</li> <li>• Expenses covered to the value of \$20,000 to obtain a PPL</li> <li>• Mentorship from flight training provider's instructors</li> <li>• Bi-monthly progress reporting with Parafield Airport Limited and flight training provider</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>Opportunities to attend events and functions with AAL staff in relation to the Scholarship</p>

<b>Selection Criteria</b>	<p>An essay submission will be required upon application, addressing the following questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Why do you want to become a pilot?</li> <li>• What would it mean to you, to be awarded the scholarship?</li> <li>• What flying experience do you have, if any?</li> </ul> <p>Applicants will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• attend school within the following Council areas: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• City of Salisbury</li> <li>• City of Tea Tree Gully</li> <li>• City of Playford</li> </ul> </li> <li>• be in year 11 or 12 at school within one of these council areas to apply for the Private Pilot Scholarship</li> <li>• commit to attending a minimum two lessons a month with the approved flight training provider.</li> <li>• attend bi-monthly progression reviews with responsible adult/s</li> </ul> <p>Studying and passing one or more of the following subjects is preferred but not mandatory:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Biology</li> <li>• Chemistry</li> </ul>

<b>Desirable Experience</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Demonstrated involvement with community groups, particularly with an aviation focus</li> <li>• Demonstrated leadership positions in school and /or after school activities</li> <li>• Attendance at career readiness programs within school curriculum</li> <li>• Experience as an airline passenger</li> </ul>
<b>Personal Attributes</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Demonstrated commitment to AAL's vision, mission and values;</li> <li>• Adequate verbal and written communication skills and ability to communicate effectively;</li> <li>• Well-groomed professional appearance and presentation;</li> <li>• Ability to accept responsibility and work under pressure with conflicting deadlines.</li> <li>• Have a "can do" attitude</li> <li>• Confident in asking questions and seeking clarification</li> </ul>

<b>Competency Requirements</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Building Trust</b> – the ability to interact with others in a way that gives them confidence in one's intentions</li> <li>• <b>Building Work Relationships</b> – developing strong and professional relationships with Parafield Airport Limited and the flight training provider</li> <li>• <b>Continuous Improvement</b> – the ability to identify area/s for improvement and receive feedback on performance in a professional manner.</li> <li>• <b>Managing Work</b> – effectively manage time and resources to progress through the Scholarship in a realistic time frame.</li> <li>• <b>Planning and Organising</b> – establishing courses of action ensure that work is completed efficiently</li> <li>• <b>Results Orientation</b> – set realistic and reasonable standards for self and show concern for all aspects of the scholarship, no matter how small; initiate or take on responsibility and accountability for successfully completing tasks;</li> </ul> <p>Applicants will be required to undergo the following testing and background checks the Scholarship is awarded:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The ability to provide 100 points of identification</li> <li>• The ability to obtain an Aviation Security Identification Card (ASIC)</li> <li>• Successful physical medical examination</li> <li>• Undertake a trial flight with flight training provider</li> <li>• Successful completion of online medical questionnaire through Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA)</li> <li>• The ability to apply for an Aviation Reference Number through CASA</li> <li>• The ability to pass an aptitude test</li> </ul> <p>The scholarship will only be awarded to an applicant who meets these criteria.</p> <p>Parafield Airport Limited reserves the right not to award a scholarship in any given year if, in its absolute opinion, there are no suitable applicants.</p>
